

D.A.R.E. Family Talk

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In D.A.R.E. class your child has discussed the Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How about Bullying.

BULLYING IS WHEN SOMEONE USES HIS OR HER STRENGTH OR "POWER" TO CONTROL SOMEONE ELSE. SOMETIMES THIS HAPPENS WHEN SOMEONE HURTS OR SCARES ANOTHER PERSON ON PURPOSE, AND THE PERSON BEING BULLIED HAS A HARD TIME DEFENDING HIMSELF OR HERSELF. USUALLY, BULLYING HAPPENS OVER AND OVER.

Taking a Stand to Stop Bullying:

Solving this problem involves everyone. Talking with and actively listening to your child are equally important as they develop skills for good citizenship.

Have your child share with you what they have learned and discuss ways they can help stop bullying.
