

D.A.R.E. FAMILY TALK Take Home Activities

Information for D.A.R.E. Instructors

The D.A.R.E. FAMILY TALK activities are designed to promote adult involvement in development of their child's abilities and skills to resist becoming involved with illicit drug use. These five take home activities enhance D.A.R.E. lessons with the goal of each student "teaching" their families what they learned. The activity sheets should be distributed at the end of the class, instructing students to enjoy sharing the lesson with their family.

Each FAMILY TALK activity compliments the lesson objective as reflected in the sequence below. **Please note**, based upon the needs of a specific class, D.A.R.E. instructors have the flexibility to decide where "FAMILY TALK" activities may best reinforce the key learning objectives.
